

Birds

Over 50 species of birds have been observed in Cherry Creek by residents. Including several listed as Species of Special Concern.

An FWC document consolidates the official state of Florida list of endangered species, threatened species, and species of special concern. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) maintains the state list of animals designated as endangered, threatened, or species of special concern, in accordance with Rules 68A-27.003, 68A-27.004, and 68A-27.005, respectively, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.)

These species are listed in the 2006 FWC listings of Species of Special Concern and Endangered Species:

White Ibis	<i>Eudocimus albus</i>	SSC
Wood Stork	<i>Mycteria americana</i>	E (endangered)
Osprey	<i>Pandion haliaetus</i>	SSC
Little Blue Heron	<i>Egretta caerulea</i>	SSC
